Subject: Clark County Democrats Ethics and Conduct

1.0 Purpose

The CCDCC organization is the public face of the Democratic Party in Clark County. A critical part of our mission is to promote and practice the basic principles of honesty and fair play in our elections, candidates, campaigns and day-to-day operations. CCDCC members and volunteers will appreciate that this policy is meant to supplement their own good judgment and they will follow both the spirit and the letter of this policy.

2.0 Clark County Democrats Ethics Policy

As members and volunteers of the Clark County Democratic Central Committee, each of us has the right to expect of each other certain standards of ethical behavior including but not limited to:

- 2.1 Respect for the property of others both personal and collective;
- 2.2 Respect for and the preservation of the dignity of others;
- 2.3 Active preservation of truth and trust between people;
- 2.4 Respect for and adherence to the rule of law in all activities performed in representation of the Clark County Democrats and their candidates.

3.0 Code of Conduct

- 3.1 CCDCC assets and resources (e.g., computers, internet, etc) are provided to conduct and promote the organization's mission, goals and business, and should be used solely for those purposes.
- 3.2 When representing the CCDCC, members and volunteers are asked to remember they are, at that moment, the public face of the organization and consider their actions and words are seen as such, and act accordingly.

4.0 Conflict of Interest

- 4.1 As conflict of interest, actual or perceived may reflect negatively on our efforts, members and volunteers are expected to disclose possible conflict and recuse themselves from discussion and decision-making when such action may benefit themselves, their family member, their business or other affiliation.
- 4.2 In accordance with the CCDCC mission to elect Democrats, the CCDCC endorses Democratic candidates in partisan elections, and recommends Democratic candidates in non-partisan elections. When an individual, or an affiliated organization, with a seat on CCDCC Executive Committee endorses or publically supports a non-Democratic candidate in opposition to a CCDCC candidate, they must leave the Executive Committee meeting when any discussions occur concerning the campaign of the candidate they oppose.
