6. ACTION: Seek a motion to adopt and send this request to Washington's Democrats in Congress
As the [budget continuing resolutions are considered in March](#), please vote no unless the following provisions are included.
 - a. *Save 20 million HIV victims by giving them their medicine back. MAGA leadership took their life-saving medicine away, without which these 20 million human beings will die of AIDS. Restore this funding and all USAID funding.*
 - b. *Make it clearly illegal for any member of the executive branch to interfere with the U.S. Marshals carrying out their sworn Constitutional obligation to enforce court orders and protect the checks and balances established by the United States Constitution.*
 - c. *Re-affirm and strengthen the existing law that the executive branch cannot suspend elections.*
 - d. *Establish a two-year moratorium on any changes to election laws, including the SAVE Act and any other attempts to change the rules of elections before the 2026 midterms.*
 - e. *Protect America's middle class by requiring Congressional approval for executive actions that would hurt middle class jobs and affordability, including tariffs, trade wars, pulling billions out of local economies, laying off thousands of local workers, and taking medical benefits away from working Americans.*
 - f. *Make it clearly illegal for the executive branch to declare martial law.*
7. ACTION: The Executive Committee unanimously recommends that the General Membership endorse IAFF Local 2444 Camas/Washougal's [proposition](#) for the April 22 election, "City of Camas and City of Washougal Proposition No. 1 – Creation of Camas-Washougal Fire Authority."
8. ACTION: Seek volunteers to be Community Liaisons. Choose a local group and attend at the representative of the Democrats. Listen, learn, and show our support. Pins and shirts will be available.
